X'S HEADLINES

TODAY: The Explorers seven-game road trip continues with game one of a four game series against the Kansas City Monarchs in KCK.

SUNDAY: It was a walk-off win for the Kane County Cougars Sunday afternoon as they took down the Sioux City Explorers 5-4 to claim the series. The Explorers kept it close most of the game with four X's having a multi-hit day, but the Cougars came through in the tenth inning for the victory.

PITCHING MATCHUP: #15 LHP Austin Drury (2-5, 6.75) will open the series for Sioux City while #46 RHP Hunter McMahon (3-2, 3.22) gets the nod for Kansas City.

VS KANSAS CITY. The X's opened the 2024 season just like they did last season hosting the Kansas City Monarchs. KC took all three games of the series. When the two teams met up again the X's won the only game that was played of the three games due to weather and playable field conditions. In 2023 the Explorers won the season series ruling the Monarchs going 9-3. Sioux City took the 2022 season series 7-5. Overall, in the American Association the X's lead the head-to-head 69-66.

UP NEXT: Following the series at Kansas City the Explorers will return to Siouxland for a weekend series against Fargo-Moorhead Friday August 9 through Sunday August 11.

SCOREBOARD WATCHING: The X's enter play today with 27 games remaining and sit three games behind Kansas City for a playoff spot. Sioux City will face the reigning Miles Wolff Cup Champions nine more times this season beginning tonight. Four games will be played on the road five in Sioux City.

KC DOUBLE: The X's will make up their pair of games that were postponed in June during the month of August. The first one will be made up tomorrow. August 6 at Legends Field and again in Sioux City on August 20 with the first pitch for game one set for 5:35 pm at Lewis and Clark Park.

THE SPLITS: The Explorers have hit .254 against righties this season and .295 against portsiders.

AUGUST MOON: While things have been a little up and down for the Explorers this season history has been good to the club in the month of August over the last few years. Since 2018 the X's have had four winning months and the only losing month the team still made the postseason. The Explorers are 78-60 over the last five seasons they have played (minus 2020 the team did not play) for a .565 winning percentage. The club is 2-2 so far in the month of August.

BATTER OF THE MONTH: The American Association has named first basemen John Nogowski the Rawlings Batter of the month for the month of July. Nogowski went 39-for-87, hitting a league-leading .448 for the month with four home runs and 17 RBI. He had 14 multi-hit games and finished the month with a 3-for-4 night in the X's 8-2 win over Lincoln on Wednesday night, July 31, and he had a four-hit game last Sunday, August 28 in Cleburne. Nogowski hit safely in 20 of 25 games during the month and added 23 walks and a .566 on-base percentage. This is the first batter of the month award for Sioux City since the award started in 2011. The X's have had several pitchers of the month awards: Matt Pobereyko June 2021, Justin Vernia June 2018 June, RHP Ryan Zimmerman June 2015 and Rob Wort August 2015.

THE STATE HOUSE: The J.D. Scholten story continued last Thursday when the Saltdogs went to the polls and were defeated by the Explorers behind another quality start for Scholten. He tossed 6.1 innings giving up two earned runs to run his record to (4-0). Scholten, who is a member of the Iowa House of Representatives for District 1 was signed by the Explorers to make an emergency start Saturday July 6. 102 pitches later the 44-year-old Scholten left the game with a quality start going 6.2 innings and holding Milwaukee to two earned runs on seven hits to pick up the win. He was on the stump again last week in another winning campaign stop at home going 5.1 innings picking up a win over Sioux Falls in game two of a doubleheader sweep of the Canaries. The week prior he swung through Fargo where he helped end a three-game losing streak by tossing another quality start going six innings holding the RedHawks to one run in a 3-1. He went 4.1 down in Texas against the red-hot Railroaders last Friday with six strikeouts. In a recent development the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown has reached out for his cap from his first start for Sioux City. LAST 10: Scott Ota is starting to heat up. He added an RBI last night and is 14-for-his-last 39 going into the game today with four RBI and six runs scored. He has been great all season with RISP hitting .354 with 39 RBI and with two outs with RISP .306 with 15 runs driven in.

ON THIS DAY IN X'S HISTORY: August 6, 1994, former Major League pitcher Dennis "oil can" Boyd would be forced to miss the rest of the Sioux City Explorers season due to surgery to repair a blood clot in his throwing shoulder. Boyd was 4-1 at the time of his injury with a 1.89 ERA for Sioux City in 10 starts. He pitched in 76.1 innings with 43 strikeouts for the X's in 94. After his July 26 start, he felt soreness and consulted Boston Red Sox doctor Aurthur Pappas who had treated his same injury in 1989 while in the Major Leagues with Boston. The test were positive for a blood clot which originally were an issue in 1988 for Boyd. Boyd would undergo surgery on the 6th of August in Sioux City at Marian Health Center. Oil Can decided to stay in Sioux City the rest of the season as a non-playing coach. Sioux City manager Ed Nottle was quoted nationally that day, "He has already told me that he will rehabilitate the shoulder and is already excited about returning for next season." In 1995 Boyd returned and went 6-6 with a 6-6 ERA in 1-7.1 innings for the X's.

SIOUX CITY FLASHBACK: Today we continue our new chapter as we take our DeLorean back in time to 1891. The Sioux City Huskers had an eventful 1891. They also had a pretty good collection of talent like infielder Parson Nicholson. Thomas Clark Nicholson was born on April 14, 1863, in Blaine, Ohio, He played principally as a second baseman and in the minor leagues He first appeared in box scores catching and playing second base for the Belleaire Globes in 1883 through 1885. At the age of 23 he hit .357 combined between Steubenville and Wheeling, catching the attention of the St. Louis Browns. In late September 1887, Parson Nicholson got the chance of a lifetime - an opportunity to play in the World Series. The American Association champion St. Louis Browns were looking for a second baseman to fill in for Yank Robinson, whose hand had been spiked in a game earlier in the month. Nicholson received a telegram from St. Louis inquiring what he would ask to play with the Browns through their games with Detroit. He wired back naming \$300. Nicholson must not have realized he was dealing with Chris Von der Ahe, who was notoriously cheap. Von der Ahe signed Harry Lyons instead. Robinson played in the bulk of the games for the Browns in their World Series against the National League champion Detroit Wolverines, with Lyons playing in just two of them. Detroit won the series, 10 games to 5. Perhaps if Nicholson had asked for only \$250, the outcome of the series might have been different. Nicholson ultimately signed with the Browns in late October 1887, too late to play in the Series but found himself in the minors again as the season began. He did play three seasons in Major League Baseball for the Detroit Wolverines in 1888, the Toledo Maumees in 1890, and the Washington Senators in 1895. Nicholson's only full season in the major leagues came in 1890 with Toledo when he appeared in 134 games, all at second base, and compiled a .268 batting average with 11 triples, four home runs, 72 RBIs and 46 stolen bases. Out of the majors again, Nicholson signed with Sioux City in the Western Association for 1891. He would hit .267 in 124 games for the pennant winners with 50 stolen bases. He was the rock at second and his speed was part of a club that ran Western Association clubs ragged. After the season, the pennant winners won a series against the Chicago White Stockings, 4 games to 2, and another against the St. Louis Browns, winning 5-0. Nicholson had six hits (two doubles and a triple) in the five games against the Browns, who then signed him for a reported salary of \$3500, but two weeks into spring training he was released and signed with Toledo in the fledgling Class A Western League, as manager and second baseman. He would spend the next eight years from one minor league club to the other and would again reach the big leagues in 1895. Over the course of 12 minor league seasons, Nicholson appeared in 837 games and compiled a .303 batting average with 48 triples, 37 home runs, and 354 stolen bases.

ON THE AIR: Dan Vaughan begins his second season as the broadcaster for Sioux City Explorers and his 12th season broadcasting in the American Association. Prior to coming to the Siouxland, Vaughan spent four years with the Gary SouthShore RailCats from 2013 -2016 and the last six seasons in Kansas City as the "voice of the Monarchs and T-Bones" from 2017-2022. On June 17, 2023, Vaughan called his 900th American Association game. In the Australian summer is one of the voices of the Perth Heat of the Australian Baseball League during the USA winters and co-host of *Talking Baseball Australia*. Vaughan has jumped headfirst into the exciting history of baseball in Sioux City and in the state of Iowa. A broadcast staple of his is the nightly feature of the *Sioux City Baseball Flashback*. Vaughan will look at a player or team from the long history of the great game on the area and tell that story. He can also be seen Monday through Friday on game days on *"Explorers Expresso"* on Facebook and YouTube Live. The show is a look back at the game before and a preview of that night's game. The X's will also unveil a booth camera this season for a behind the scenes look at the broadcast as it happens. The Explorers can be heard on radio locally at <u>KSCJ</u> 94.9 FM and 1360 AM and <u>online</u> with the pregame beginning 30 minutes before first pitch. All Explorers games home and away will be streamed the league broadcast site <u>www.aabaseball.tv</u>. The site features live games and bonus content on the American Association. Explorers' fans will be able to hear the X's radio audio call of the road games on the league streaming site. Austin Thomas joins Vaughan this season and returns to Sioux City for a second season but this time in an expanded role. Thomas will be part of the on-air call at home as well as studio host for road broadcast on KSCJ.

FREE TO AIR: The American Association, the fastest-growing professional baseball league in North America today announced that all live games on AABaseball.TV will now be available for free to consumers. Starting on opening day, the American Association will be the only professional baseball league in North America to offer all live games for free and without any type of paywall. With access to the game being paramount to the American Association, giving all fans an opportunity to watch live games is a natural next step for the league. These games will be available on the AABaseball TV app on iOS, Android, Apple TV, Android TV, Roku, and Amazon FireTV.

The Explorers signed LHP Austin Drury on June 4, 2024, marking a return of a key piece of the 2023 starting rotation that helped the Explorers grab a post season spot. The native of Tampa, Florida was fantastic down the stretch for Sioux City and won four straight starts to close out the season including a pair in the playoffs. He would finish the regular season with back-to-back quality starts on August 24 and 30 giving up just one earned run in 12 innings with 12 strikeouts. In the post season he picked up two more wins beating the Fargo Moorhead RedHawks on September 6 in Fargo going five innings allowing one earned run on nine hits then beat the Kansas City Monarchs on September 11 giving up one earned run on two hits over 5.2 innings. Drury added another 12 strikeout outs in the post season.

Drury finished strong overall in 2023 for Sioux City. He would allow just seven earned runs over his final seven starts totaling 39.1 innings good for a

1.61 ERA during that stretch. Drury would go 5-5 overall during the regular season in 20 starts with a 3.78 ERA. He would strike out 98 while walking 53 in 109.1 innings. Drury pitched for the Dodgers organization from 2018-22 pitching in 81.0 innings in AA between 2021-22. He's entering his fifth full season of professional baseball after spending last year with the Explorers and the beginning of this seasor in Mexico. In Mexico he made six starts for Leon going 1-4 in 20.1 innings surrendering 34 hits and 25 earned runs. He would walk 15 and strikeout 16 and post an 11.07 ERA. He would make one start for Oaxaca working in two innings allowing three earned runs with two strikeouts. Prior to coming to Sioux City in 2023 he spent 2022 with AA Tulsa. He tossed 37.1 IP with a 4.34 ERA, and 30 strikeouts in 28 games. The previous year was his first season in AA after being promoted from High-A Great Lakes. With Tulsa that year, he had a 4.53 ERA with 49 strikeouts over 43.2 IP. In High-A he pitched even better, with a 3.00 ERA and 1.25 WHIP over 24.0 IP. 2019 was Drury's first full season of pro baseball, pitching between High-A and Class-A throughout the year. Overall, he went 64.0 IP with a 3.09 ERA and 70 strikeouts between both levels as a 21-year-old. In 2018, he was drafted by the Dodgers after three seasons at North Florida. In his first professional stint, he went 29.2 innings with a 1.21 ERA between rookie ball and Class-A after converting to a full-time reliever.

In college, Drury was almost exclusively a starter, starting 37 games of the 40 he pitched in. He pitched well in his first two seasons a North Florida before struggling in 2018. His last season saw him go 68.2 IP with a 4.85 ERA and 58 strikeouts across 13 contests. In his first two seasons, he went 12-3 over 146 innings with a 3.51 ERA and 109 strikeouts.

> Overview: OF Zac Vooletich signed with the Sioux City Explorers after last having played in the MLB Draft League. The former Texas Tech Red Raider enters the season as a 24-year-old right-handed hitter who has spent almost his whole life in Texas. He comes up to Sioux City looking to keep the high batting average and on-base skills he's showcased his whole collegiate career.

> 2023: Last summer with State College in the MLB Draft League, Vooletich played in 31 games. Across the season, he batted .287 with a .418 on-base percentage. While he didn't hit a home run in the league, he still managed 13 RBIs and 20 runs with eight extra-base hits. He joined the MLB Draft League after playing 39 games for the Red Raiders in the Big 12. During his final season at Texas Tech, he broke out for a slash line of .388/.443/.560. His explosive performance throughout the year helped Texas Tech make the NCAA baseball tournament where he earned Gainesville All-Regional Team honors. He ended his career as a Red Raider with a .351 batting average over 202 at-bats.

▶ 2022: During the summer of 2022, Vooletich competed in the California Collegiate League, ripping the cover off the ball for a .345 batting average with a .543 OBP and 1.222 OPS. Along with his astounding numbers from the plate, he also stole 13 bases without getting caught and scored 42 runs throughout the season. Before that, it was the outfielder's first season at Texas Tech after transferring from Navarro College. Throughout the collegiate season, he batted .279 with an .846 OPS and 18 RBIs.

> 2021 NAV: 2021 was Vooletich's only season at Navarro College, putting up a .372 batting average with seven homers and 45 RBIs. Along with that, he stole 29 bases and posted 58 runs scored.


>2019-20 NMJC: Before Navarro College, the righty bat played at New Mexico Junior College. At NMJC in 2020, he batted .313 with 11 RBI and nine stolen bases in the 21 games before the season was shutdown. His first collegiate season, he played as a walk-on for the Thunderbirds, helping them reach the NJCAA World Series with a .351 batting average and 52 RBIs.

► Overview: Nick Shumpert will make his return to the American Association where he made previous stops at Cleburne and Fargo-Moorhead after spending 2023 with the Washington Nationals organization. He would play in 42 games for Wilmington in the South Atlantic League last season, hitting .168 with three home runs and seven RBI. Shumpert would steal six bases in seven attempts while playing seven games at shortstop, seven at second base and another six at third base. Shumpert would also play all three outfield positions while with Wilmington.

▶ 2022: In 2022, Shumpert would play 91 games for the Cleburne Railroaders, hitting eight homers while driving in 50 runs. He would slash a line of .265/.310/.421 while stealing 29 bases for Cleburne. He would not sign with Detroit but rather chose to go to San Jacinto Junior College where the Braves would call his name the next season. Shumpert has a pair of pro baseball connections in his family. His father, Terry Shumpert, spent parts of 14 seasons in the Major Leagues and his cousin is current Major Leaguer Mookie Betts.

▶ Overview: C Jake Ortega returns to Sioux City where he played in 70 games in 2023, hitting .265 with four home runs and 26 RBI. Ortega would slash a line of .265/.368/.368 while catching in 41 games and would add another18 games at third base for the X's. Ortega got off to a fast start to the season with a six-game hitting streak, going 9-for-25 and hitting .346 in the month of May. In June, he would hit .282 with a home run and 12 RBI, including a season-high nine-game hitting streak (14-for-37) from June 9 to June 18. Ortega finished fourth on the club with 14 multi-hit games for the Explorers. He had two three-hit games in a pair of wins for Sioux City during the season. He would go 3-for-5 on June 7 in a 12-9 win over Sioux Falls at Lewis and Clark Park, and on July 14 he would go 3-for-5 in the X's 8-5 win at Fargo-Moorhead, adding a homer and two more RBI. The California native would record back-to-back two-hit games on July 27 and 28 part of his15 two-hit games, a stat good for third on the team. Defensively, Ortega was forced to play 18 games at third base during the season and would have a 1.000 fielding percentage. In his 41 games behind the plate, Ortega would throw out 11 runners in 59 attempts for a 19% caught-stealing percentage.

> 2023: Ortega comes to the Explorers after taking the year off baseball in 2022, originally inking with the team on May 2, 2023. Ortega spent four seasons with Cal State-Bakersfield before being drafted by the Mets in the 28th round of the 2019 MLB Draft. He spent 2019-2021 in the minors, reaching AA in 2021 with the Mets organization.

▶ 2021: In 2021, Ortega split time between AA and rookie ball, playing in 19 games at the rookie level and batting .269 with a .713 OPS. With AA Binghamton, he didn't play much, only seeing action in five games and having 12 plate appearances. Before that, he split his first full professional season at Low-A and High-A in the Mets organization. Between the levels, he played in 32 games and held a .242 batting average with a .307 OBP. In his two pro seasons with the Mets organization, he threw out 27 runners in 71 stolen base attempts for a 39% caught stealing percentage.

▶ 2013-19: Ortega was drafted by the Mets in 2019 after having an outstanding senior season at Cal-State-Bakersfield, batting .326 with a .418 OBP and .818 OPS in 53 games that year. In 2018 he hit .245 in 47 games with 14 RBI. During his 2017, sophomore season, he batted .322 with a .390 OBP over 41 games after hitting .286 in his freshman season in 44 games. Ortega is a career .273 hitter across 364 games between professional and college ball. Behind the plate, combined in his career he has a 31% caught-stealing percentage. Ortega is a 2015 graduate of Capistrano Valley High School and hails from Mission Viejo, California. He was selected to the 2013 and 2014 Perfect Game Underclass honorable mention All-American list and was named to the 2013-14 Southern California Top 20 All-Star Team.

► Overview: OF Scott Ota returns for a second season with the X's in 2024. Ota originally joined the Explorers on July 20, 2023, as a free agent after his release from the New York Mets organization. The California native hit .265 over his first 10 games then became one of the American Association's best hitters the rest of the season. Over the final 28 games of the season, Ota hit .325 (37-for-114) with five home runs and 20 RBI. He would lead the X's in home runs the final two months (5) and the 20 RBI over the same stretch tied him with Matt Lloyd and Vince Fernandez.

▶ 2023: For the season, Ota would play in 38 games while slashing a line of .311/.371/.520 with the Explorers. His .520 slugging percentage placed him second on the club for the season. He would have 15 multi-hit games out of his 38 games with the X's, including his last three regular season games from August 31 to September 2 where he went 6-for-12. Ota had a four-game stretch of multi-hit games on August 19 to 23, going 9-for-20 for Sioux City. He would add a 12-game hitting streak from July 30 to August 17 with 16 hits in 43 at bats, hitting .372 in that span.

▶ 2019-22: Ota joined Sioux City from the New York Mets organization where he hit .242 in 23 games at A level St. Lucie and seven games at high A Brooklyn in 2023 with one home run and eight RBI. He would put up a slash line of .242/.304/.352 in 30 games. In 2022 Ota would be limited to four games due to injury while at the Mets rookie-level club, Florida Complex League, hitting .143 with one RBI. Overview: INF Cameron Cannon was traded to the Sioux City Explorers to continue his fifth season of professional baseball after spending parts of 2024 with the Cleburne Railroaders and Kansas City Monarchs. He played 2023 with the Monarchs after part of the year in the Philadelphia Phillies organization which followed his time in the Boston Red Sox system. He previously reached AAA with Boston's Worcester after being drafted in the second round of the 2019 MLB draft out of the University of Arizona.
 2024: Earlier in 2024 with the Railroaders, Cannon had a good stretch in only six games, batting .304 with an .868 OPS. With the Railroaders, he recorded three multi-hit games, each with an extra-base hit. The righty bat was acquired by Cleburne earlier in the year from Kansas City where he played 22 games for the Monarchs. With KC, he posted a .283 on-base percentage to pair with a .628 OPS and similarly had a few big games, including one against Lincoln on May 26 where he went 3-4 with a home run.
 2023: Cannon played in just eight games for the Monarchs in 2023 after being released from the Phillies organization, starting off hot with a 2-3 game against the RedHawks which included a triple, although he cooled down after that. In the Phillies system, Cannon mostly played at AA Reading where he posted a .655 OPS across 46 games, hitting six home runs and 11 doubles for a .394 slugging percentage. His season included a great stretch near the end of April where he went 11-20 with five extra-base hits across five games.

2022: In 2022, Cannon made his way up to AAA in the Red Sox organization, making his first start July 24 and batting .257 across his 12 games. In his time in Worcester, he had two multi-hit games, recording a double in each one. He played most of his 2022 season at AA Portland however, making 35 appearances with a .318 OBP. Like 2023, he had a hot streak in April where he batted .346 over seven games between April 16 and April 24, collecting two extra-base hits while reaching base at a .370 clip.

▶ 2021: 2021 was Cannon's first season at the AA level, graduating from High-A in early August and finishing the season with Portland. With AA Portland, Cannon had a .383 slugging percentage while picking up nine extra-base hits, three of which were homers, across 24 games. His promotion came after playing 74 games with High-A Greenville, batting .302 with an .808 OPS during his time there. He ended his time in High-A on a torrid stretch, batting .370 with a .937 OPS between July 6 and his promotion Aug. 8. Over those 25 games, he had 11 RBI with 10 extra-base hits, scoring 15 times and swiping three bases.

▶ 2019-20: Prior to the COVID year, Cannon played part of his first professional season in the Red Sox organization in Low-A after just three games at rookie ball. With Low-A Lowell, Cannon slashed had a .289 OBP with a .624 OPS over 42 games, hitting three homers and 12 doubles while driving in 21.

▶ 2019 ARI: The Red Sox drafted Cannon in the second round of the 2019 MLB Draft after a stellar junior season with the Arizona Wildcats. In his final season, he played in 56 games, batting .397 with an unbelievable 1.129 OPS, earning himself Baseball America All-America First-Team honors. Through the season, he led the team and ranked second in the PAC-12 in batting average while leading the nation with 29 doubles.

▶ 2017-18 ARI: During his sophomore season with the Wildcats in 2018, Cannon earned honorable mention All-PAC-12 honors, batting .321 while posting a .976 OPS across 56 games. During the season, he had a stretch where he hit four homers in five games between March 30 and April 7. This season followed a freshman year where he started 27 of his 35 games, batting .274 with five extra-base hits.

► History: Cannon decided to go to the Wildcats after being drafted in the 21st round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks out of Mountain Ridge High School. His parents are Chris Cannon and Kim Belanger and he has three siblings, including Tanner Murphy who was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 2010 MLB Draft and played for the Winnipeg Goldeyes in 2016. ► Overview: John Nogowski returns to Sioux City for the third time in his career. The Nogowski professional career story can be told in three chapters. Chapter one—following his release from the Oakland Athletics organization in 2016, he came to Sioux City where he would open the 2017 season with the X's. Nogowski would hit an outstanding .402 with a 1.089 OPS and four home runs and drive in 28 runs. The St. Louis Cardinals would receive the transfer of his contract after just 34 contests with the Explorers. Chapter two—climbing through the Cardinals system, Nogowski reached the Big Leagues in 2020. Chapter three—Nogowski played with the Pittsburgh Pirates for part of the 2021 season and spent time at AAA and in Mexico from 2021 to 2023.

► 2023 SC: Nogowski had two stints with Sioux City in 2023. He signed with the Explorers on June 15 after spending the first part of the 2023 season in the Atlantic League with the High Point Rockers where he batted lights out. Nogowski hit .294, blasting 11 home runs in 37 games while knocking in 49 runs. He would slash a line at the plate of .297/.419/.625 for the Rockers.

► 2023 First Half: In his first 17 games with the Explorers, he hit .397 with two home runs and nine RBI before having his contract transferred to Monclova in the Mexican League on July 5.

► 2023 Mexico: While in Mexico, Nogowski hit .277 in 25 games with 14 RBI. Following the elimination of Monclova from post-season consideration, Nogowski returned to Sioux City on August 18 and was a big part of the club's stretch drive to the post-season. He would drive in another seven runs in 17 games with two round trippers. Nogowski would hit another homer in five playoff games, going 7-for-23 with an RBI and scoring four runs. For the season, the Florida native hit .317 with five home runs and 16 RBI. Nogowski would add eight doubles to his stat totals in 2023, while slashing a line of .317/.419/.480.

▶ 2022: In 2022, Nogowski started the season with the Atlanta Braves organization, playing in 40 games at AAA and getting on base at a .338 clip. After he was released by the Braves, Nogowski signed with the Washington Nationals on a minor league contract, splitting time between AAA and AA. At AAA Rochester he played well, earning a .290 batting average and .810 OPS over 203 plate appearances while also getting on base at a .409 clip. At AA that year, he landed on base .333 percent of the time over 30 games while posting a .682 OPS.

▶ 2020-21: The 31-year-old spent parts of two seasons in the MLB between the Cardinals and Pirates organizations. He debuted in 2020 with the Cardinals before he was traded to the Pittsburgh Pirates in July 2021. In 2021 Nogowski made the Cardinals out of spring training and played parts of 19 games, recording one hit over 20 plate appearances. He would spend most of his time with the Cardinals organization at AAA Memphis before he was traded, batting .195 with a .601 OPS. Nogowski immediately made an impact for the Pirates following the trade in early July and went 2-4 with three runs, an RBI and a walk in his first game with Pittsburgh. Over his first 12 games with Pittsburgh, he batted .438 with a 1.074 OPS, including four doubles and a home run. On July 7, he went 4-5 against the Braves as one of his seven multi-hit games for the Pirates. He finished his time with the Aior League club holding a .261 batting average with a .677 OPS over 33 games. In his 20 games with AAA Indianapolis, No gowski posted a .406 OBP and .758 OPS before he was released. The San Francisco Giants picked him up to end the 2021 season, where he played in two series for AAA Sacramento.

▶ 2020: During the COVID season, Nogowski spent most of his time with the Alternate Training Site for the Cardinals, but he finally made his debut on August 16 against the Chicago White Sox. In his one game that year, he went 1-4 with a strikeout before he returned to the training site.

▶ 2018-19: In 2019, Nogowski spent the entire year with AAA Memphis. He hit .295 with a .413 OBP and .889 OPS over 117 games, including a 4-5 game where he added two runs, three RBIs and a homer against the Reno Aces on June 7. In 2018, he spent most of his time with the AA squad, batting .309 with an .855 OPS over 83 games.

▶ 2017: As a 24-year-old in 2017, Nogowski joined the X's after he was released by the Athletics the year prior. He had four three-hit games that season, including a two-home run, five-RBI game versus Gary on June 2. He had his contract transferred to the Cardinals on June 26 and played mostly at AA the rest of the season, working a .295 batting average with a .760 OPS over 59 games.

▶ 2015-16: 2016 was Nogowski's last season with the Athletics organization, playing at AA and High-A over the year. While in High-A, he batted .285 with a .764 OPS over 84 games, and in AA, he batted .130 with a .535 OPS. He spent the 2015 season with High-A Stockton, batting .274 with a .716 OPS and 24 extra-base hits over 96 games. He spent his first season in affiliated ball between Low-A and rookie ball with the Athletics after his junior year with FSU. Across the season, he hit .264 with a .351 OBP and .699 OPS between the levels.

► 2014: With FSU in 2014, he made the All-ACC first team as one of three Seminoles to play in all 60 games. He hit .307 with 12 doubles and five homers in his final se ason with Florida State. ► Overview: Osvaldo Martinez joins the Sioux City Explorers this season with a long career behind him which includes two seasons at the major league level. The veteran infielder has spent each of the last three seasons in the American Association following a few years in the Atlantic League. Across five seasons in MLB Partner Leagues, he has hit .269 with a .695 OPS across 454 games.

▶ 2023: Martinez spent last year with the Sioux Falls Canaries, playing in 71 games across the season. In total, the righty bat earned a .277 batting average to pair with a .352 on-base percentage. This included a stretch of games from July 29 to Aug. 17 where he batted .357 against teams like Milwaukee, Fargo-Moorhead and eventual champions Kansas City.

▶ 2022: 2022 was Martinez's first year with the Canaries and throughout the season posted a .271 batting average with a .697 OPS over 86 games. Similar to 2023, he had a blazing hot start to August, recording six straight multi-hit games between July 30 and Aug. 6. By the end of the year, he had six homers and five steals as well.

▶ 2021: The year before, Martinez played his first in the American Association by joining the Cleburne Railroaders. With Cleburne, the infielder crushed the ball, batting .315 with a .855 OPS and 14 homers. He also had a career-high 56 RBIs to pair with 81 runs scored.

▶ 2019-20: Because of the pandemic in 2020, Martinez was restricted to playing only winter ball, playing in both the Caribbean Series and Puerto Rican Winter League between 2019 and 2021. In 2019, he played his final season in the Atlantic League. As a member of the New Britain Bees, Martinez batted .227 with a .591 OPS but still managed to score 52 runs.

2018: In 2018, Martinez had his first season in an MLB Partner League, playing for the Road Warriors in the Atlantic League. He had a .256 batting average and a .654 OPS that year, playing in 105 games and launching seven home runs.
 2017: Martinez's last season in affiliated ball came in 2017 as a part of the Chicago Cubs organization. That year, he split time between AA and AAA, playing in 61 total games.

▶ 2017: Martinez's last season in affiliated ball came in 2017 as a part of the Chicago Cubs organization. That year, he split time between AA and AAA, playing in 61 total games. With AAA lowa, the righty hit .222, garnering 32 hits including two doubles and a dinger. He was moved to AA Tennessee in August where he played much better, working a .292 average with a .771 OPS over 51 plate appearances.

▶ 2016: Prior to joining the Cubs system, Martinez was with the Orioles organization. In 2016, he played the entire year with AAA Norfolk, batting .236 with a .271 on-base percentage, scoring 26 runs with 34 RBIs. While he struggled in some months, that certainly wasn't the case between June and July where he had a .336 batting average and .837 OPS over 27 games between June 19 and July 24. Later in the season he also had a four-hit game against the Charlotte Knights which saw him rip a homer and notch four RBIs.

▶ 2015: 2015 saw Martinez play his first year in Baltimore's organization, appearing in 122 games. He worked a .252 batting average and a .310 on-base percentage in his age 27 season, stealing nine bases and scoring 48 runs as well. Early in the season against the Richmond Flying Squirrels, he had back-to-back games where he went a combined 7-8 from the plate with two RBIs and a home run while batting .349 between May 10 and May 30.

▶ 2014: In 2014, the then-26-year-old split the season between the Atlanta Braves and Los Angeles Dodgers organizations after being traded in mid-May. He started the year with AA Chattanooga as a part of LA's system, playing in 33 games with 10 runs and 11 RBIs. On May 18 he was traded to Atlanta where he would play 78 games for AAA Gwinnett, posting a strong .288 batting average and .340 on-base percentage. He scored 26 runs while knocking in 22 RBIs with 11 doubles and two triples.

▶ 2013: His only full season with the Dodgers organization was in 2013 when he split time between AAA and AA. He started the year in AAA Albuquerque, posting a .348 on-base percentage and .732 OPS over 12 games while grabbing five runs and four RBIs. He was moved to AA Chattanooga after that and throughout the season, he had a .249 average and .647 OPS. He also had four homers while scoring 20 times with 19 RBIs.

▶ 2012: 2012 was Martinez's first professional season outside of the Marlins organization, playing for both the Chicago White Sox and Dodgers system. After being traded in September 2011 to the White Sox as part of the trade for former White Sox manager Ozzie Guillen, Martinez was assigned to play for AAA Charlotte. Over 60 games for the Knights, he had 13 RBIs and 15 runs while recording 38 hits and 11 doubles. In July, Martinez was sent to the LA organization for cash considerations where he was assigned to AAA Albuquerque. With the Isotopes, he batted .255 with a .296 on-base percentage across 39 games.

▶ 2011: Martinez last played in the majors in 2011 when he would split the season between the Florida Marlins and AAA New Orleans. He switched between the two several times throughout the season and in total, played in 20 games for the MLB squad. In his time that year, he batted .130 with three hits and an RBI. He got most of his game experience that season playing in AAA, working 371 plate appearances for the Zephyrs and batting .245 with a .296 on-base percentage.

▶ 2010: In 2010, Martinez made his major league debut with the Marlins as a September call-up from AA Jacksonville. He finished the season in the MLB playing 14 games and scoring eight runs while batting .326 with an .848 OPS. He recorded four doubles and a triple while getting on base at a .383 clip. Before his call-up, Martinez played strong baseball for AA Jacksonville, hitting .302 with a .773 OPS over 130 games. The season included multiple hot streaks including between July 5 and Aug. 9 where he hit .385 with a .998 OPS and between April 15 and May 18 where he hit .399 with a .974 OPS.

▶ 2008-09: Prior to his major league fast track, Martinez played for High-A Jupiter in 2009, posting a .254 batting average and .644 OPS with 54 runs and 45 RBIs. He also had an impressive 16 stolen bases through the 130 games while notching 22 extra-base hits. In 2008, he played for Class-A Greensboro, batting .296 with a .743 OPS. He was able to knock six home runs with 29 RBIs and 44 runs while playing in 85 games.

▶ 2007: 2007 was Martinez's first year of full-season baseball, spending most of his season with Low-A Jamestown and earning eight runs with five doubles and six RBIs across 38 games while swiping eight bases. He also played one game with High-A Jupiter that year, taking a walk in his only plate appearance.

▶ 2006: Martinez's first season of professional baseball was in 2006 as an 18-year-old. He played in 49 games for the Marlins rookie-ball team, picking up 21 RBIs and 21 runs while batting .263 with a .335 on-base percentage. The infielder comes from Carolina, Puerto Rico and is entering his 19th season of pro ball.

▶ Overview: Daniel Montano comes to Sioux City after seven seasons in the Colorado Rockies organization where the outfielder would reach the AAA level. Montano signed with the Rockies as an international free agent in 2015 out of Maracay, Venezuela. At the time of his signing, he was ranked 12th on MLB.com Top 30 International Prospects list. He joined the Rockies Dominican Summer League (DSL) team for the 2016 season at 17 years old and would slash a .228/.325/.427 line with 17 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, and 32 RBI. His nine homers led the club while his doubles ranked second. In 2017 he returned to the DOSL, playing in 52 games and slashing .270/.355/.423 on the season. He would add three home runs while leading the team doubles with 14 and RBI with 39.


▶ 2018: In 2018, Montano would begin the season once again in the DSL, but he would only stay with the club for the first 11 days of the season before a promotion to rookielevel Grand Junction in the Pioneer League. He would slash a line of .279/.338/.433 in 62 games with Grand Junction. For the third straight season, he hit double digits in doubles at 15, hit a career high five triples, and slugged four home runs. He also put his speed to work with nine stolen bases, and he drew walks at a steady clip with 21 to his 57 strikeouts. Montano would make his first appearance on a top prospect list being named number 19 on MLB.com Pipeline's top 30 prospects for the Rockies.

▶ 2019-20: Montano would continue his climb in the Rockies chain in 2019. He would cross the 100-games-played-in-a-season mark for the first time in his career while playing 122 at A-level Ashville. He would hit .218/.274/.344 with 33 walks but with 119 strikeouts. Montano once again was a doubles machine, having 32 two baggers to go with three triples and seven home runs. He added 17 stolen bases, and despite the 2020 season being cancelled, he would stay on the prospect radar at number 23 for the Rockies.

▶ 2021: With the reshuffling of the MiLB and not playing a season, Montano would end his run of being on a top prospect list in 2021. His numbers told a different story. At Low-A Fresno, he slashed .301/.380/.446 with nine doubles, three triples, four home runs, 24 walks, and six stolen bases over 52 games. Those numbers earned Montano a midseason promotion to High-A Spokane. At Spokane he slashed a .283/.353/.337 line with 20 walks and just 47 strikeouts in 44 games. He hit seven doubles with a triple for the second part of the season of 2021. At both stops combined, Montano would drive in 50 runs in 96 games hitting .293 for the season.

▶ 2022: In 2022, Montano started the season with Spokane and would have a 32-game stay in the Pacific Northwest. He slashed a .321/.420/.523 line at Spokane with only 25 strikeouts with 20 walks. He hit one home run with seven doubles and a triple. He was named the Rockies organization's Player of the Month of May before a promotion on May 31 to AA Hartford. In 82 games he would hit .253 with a .355 on base percentage. Montano hit a career high 14 home runs while driving in 39 runs and working 49 walks at the plate.

2023: Montano would continue the steady rise up the Rockies system by playing 75 games at AAA Albuquerque in 2023. He would slash a line of .237/.350/.426 with eight home runs and 46 RBI. Montano added another 13 doubles with seven team leading triples for the I sotopes. On July 31 he had a four-hit night with a homer a pair of doubles and a single in a four-hit performance against Sacramento. He would spend 10 days on an injury rehabilitation assignment at rookie-level Arizona during June, going 4 for 27 with two RBI in nine games.



► Overview: OF Justin Connell joins the Explorers following the All-Star Break after spending the first part of the season with the Lake Country DockHounds. In the winter, Connell played for the Tigres de Cartagena in the Colombian Winter League and previously was a part of the Washington Nationals organization from 2017-2023. He reached as high as Double-A after being drafted in the 11th round of the 2017 MLB Draft out of American Heritage High School.

▶ 2024 LC: During his time with the DockHounds, Connell batted .287 while posting a .794 OPS over 47 games. His final game with Lake Country came July 13 against the Explorers where he went 3-4 with a run and an RBI. Five of his final nine games with the DockHounds were also multi-hit games. He's proven to be a great base runner as well, stealing 16 bases across the season, including five in his last seven games.

▶ 2023: In the offseason with the Tigres, the outfielder played in 17 games, batting .343 with an .808 OPS over 76 plate appearances. Before that, he played all of his games in 2023 with the Double-A Harrisburg Senators but was released in April after just nine games.

▶ 2022: Connell worked up a lot more plate appearances in the 2022 season when he played 116 games in total, splitting time between the High-A Wilmington Blue Rocks and the Double-A Senators. He began the season in Double-A and played well over 96 games with the Senators, posting a .345 on-base percentage and a .396 OPS in 379 plate appearances. That stint included 11 homers and 30 extra-base hits. He started the season torching hot, posting a .925 OPS through April 28 while having a stretch where he hit home runs in six of 11 games. After hitting a cold stretch at the end of July, the Nationals decided to move Connell down to High-A, where he started returning to form by batting .254 with a .774 OPS in 20 games.

▶ 2021: 2021 was Connell's first season in High-A, playing all 98 games of the season there and posting a .293 batting average to pair with a .754 OPS as a 22-year-old. During the season, the outfielder had a 12-game hit streak between June 13 and June 27, posting a .359 batting average with a .914 OPS during that time. He also ended the season in a big way, having another big hit streak, 11 games between Aug. 11 and Aug. 27. In one of the final games of the season on Sept. 14 against the Bowling Green Hot Rods, Connell had a multi-homer night, collecting four RBI in his 3-6 performance from the plate.

▶ 2019-20: Prior to the COVID shutdown in 2020, Connell played the 2019 season for the Single-A Hagerstown Suns, playing in a career-high 120 games and batting .249 with a .658 OPS. Through the year, he had a few great batting nights, including a 4-6 night with three runs scored against the Delmarva Shorebirds on May 13, but he really picked it up late in the season, batting .282 with a .356 OBP over his final 21 games.

2018: In 2018, Connell split time between the Low-A Auburn Doubledays and the GCL Nationals in rookie ball, playing 39 games in total between the two. He started the year in rookie ball, playing in 25 games beginning June 21, but earned his promotion to Low-A after posting a .319 average with a .740 OPS in his final 14 games with the team. It took him a few games to get accustomed to Low-A, but he ended the season with three strong games where he went 5-10 with a double and stolen base. In total, the right-handed batter saw 50 plate appearances in Low-A, posting a .263 average and .710 OPS.
 2017. Over Il were defined to the team.

• 2017: Connell was drafted out of high school in the 2017 MLB Draft by the Nationals and started his career with a strong stint in rookie ball, playing in 30 games for the GCL Nationals in 2017. During the year, he had a stretch of three straight three-hit games where he went a combined 9-11 with six runs, four RBI, three walks and a double. Across the year, he posted a .323 batting average with a .772 OPS while getting on base at a .407 clip.

► History: Connell also played for Team Spain throughout his career, including the World's Baseball Classic in 2022, and came from Plantation, Fla., where he pitched during his high school days.

► Overview: C Jake Green joins the Explorers in early August in a trade with the Evansville Otters of the Frontier League. Green is currently in his second professional season of baseball after joining the Otters out of Wayland Baptist University. The 5'11 catcher played five seasons for the Wayland Baptist Pioneers after attending Sachse High School in Texas.

► 2023-24 EVA: Prior to his trade to the Explorers, Green played in 31 games for the otters, picking up seven RBI and three XBH in 115 plate appearances. That came off the heels of a successful rookie year where he batted .258 with a .706 OPS in 41 games for the Otters. Through that season, he also collected eight XBH with 10 RBI while scoring eight times.

▶ 2023 WAY: He joined the Otters after finishing his senior season with Wayland Baptist where he was named the Wayland Baptist Defensive Player of the Year. 
#10 Brandon Brosher IR/IRS: 27/9

▶ Overview: Brandon Brosher is entering his 12th season in pro baseball and his fourth season with the X's. He enters the season fifth all time in appearances in team history with 120, trailing Nate Gercken by 27 games for the top spot. In 2023, Brosher led the team with 44 games pitched in 2023, all out of the bullpen. He went 4-1 with one save while pitching 55.1 innings with a 4.07 ERA. His 64 strikeouts led all relievers for the Explorers last season. He would surrender 25 earned runs on 51 hits with a 1.265 WHIP.
 ▶ 2022: In 2022, Brosher went 3-2 with a 6.42 ERA in 47.2 innings for the X's. He finished third in appearances with 37 and third in strikeouts with 53 among Explorers relievers. For the '22 season, Brosher gave up 34 earned runs on 45 hits with a 1.615 WHIP. Prior to both 2023, and 2022, Brosher saw time with Zulia in the Venezuelan Winter League. He logged just two innings in the winter of 2022-2023 but worked 15 frames in the winter of 2021-2022, going 2-0 with a save. Brosher posted a 2.40 ERA with a 1.333 WHIP for

Zulia. >2021: His first season in Sioux City, Brosher earned six saves and dominated out of the bullpen for the 2021 Explorers. The Florida native would go 4-2, putting up a 2.51 ERA over 46.2 innings while striking out a career-high 69 batters. His strikeout total was second on the relief corps while his 39 games was good for third out of the pen. Brosher would give up 13 earned runs on 40 hits, adding a 1.329 WHIP to his numbers on the season. Brosher became the anchor for the Explorers bullpen down the final stretch. He racked up all six saves after August 18th in the X's final 21 games of the season.

▶ 2020: Brosher came to Sioux City after playing in the All-American Baseball Challenge in 2020 where he did not allow an earned run over 17.2 innings with 29 strikeouts. In 2019, Brosher pitched and occasionally swung the bat in the CAN-AM League for Trois-Rivières after being converted to a pitcher. The righty would make 64 plate appearances while batting .179 with five doubles and three stolen bases. On the hill, Brosher had a 3.71 ERA in 24 games, tossing 34 relief innings. He would go 0-2 with a save, adding 35 strikeouts and giving up 14 earned runs on 33 hits. Brosher would add a 1.441 WHIP on the season.

2016-19: Before converting to a pitcher in 2019, he was a batter first, playing six seasons mainly as a catcher in the Mets system. In his last season with the Mets in 2018, he played 28 games at High-A St. Lucie, batting .124 with a .379 OPS. In 2017, he spent the entire season at Class-A Columbia, slashing a .221/.346/.433 line with 13 home runs and 31 RBI for Columbia. Brosher spent time at three different levels between Low-A and High-A in '16. He would hit a combined .183 in 43 games with six homers and 19 RBI.
 2013-15: In 2015, Brosher made two stops in the Mets chain, playing in six games at Rookie-level Gulf Coast and another 53 games at short-season A Brooklyn in the New York-Penn League. He would hit .179 for the season combined in 59 games with three home runs and 22 RBI. Brosher played 29 games between 2013-14 in his first two seasons of professional baseball. He collected 23 hits and seven homers over 107 plate appearances in two rookie-level stops. Brosher was initially drafted in the 36th round of the 2013 draft by the New York Mets as a position player, mostly catching but also playing first and the outfield. Brosher is a native of Spring Hill, Florida and was a 2013 graduate of Springstead High School.



▶ Overview: Gercken returns to the X's for his fifth season and is the longest tenured current Explorer on the roster. The hard throwing right-hander has been a mainstay on the Explorers pitching staff. Gercken leads the franchise in appearances, going into the 2024 season at 147. In his career with Sioux City, Gercken has a 3.70 ERA in 148.2 innings, surrendering 61 earned runs with an 11-8 record and two saves. Gercken has recorded 162 strikeouts in parts of four seasons with the Explorers. Last season he made 40 appearances, going 3-3 while yielding 27 earned runs in 41.2 innings with 38 strikeouts. Gercken finished the season with a 1.728 WHIP.

▶ 2019-22: The 2022 season was another strong season for Gercken as he fashioned a 3.38 ERA as a reliever. He went 24 innings while allowing just 18 hits, adding up to a 1.83 WHIP. In 2021, he came into 40 games out of the bullpen, pitching to the tune of a 3.75 ERA with 54 strikeouts over 36 innings. During the COVID year, he went down under to play in the Australian Baseball League for Perth, where he totaled seven innings with two earned runs. 2019 was his first year with the X's; he had one of his best seasons, posting a 1.91 ERA over 47 innings with a 1.13 WHIP.

► 2020-21: Gercken has played internationally in Australia with the Alcohol Think Again Perth Heat of the Australian Baseball League. He would allow two earned runs in seven innings over six appearances out of the pen for Perth in 2020-2021. Gercken did not allow an earned run in his first five innings of relief while with the Heat. He shares baseball history of Perth with Manager Steve Montgomery who also played for the Perth Heat in the 90's. Gercken was drafted by the Twins in the 17th round of the 2015 MLB Draft out of college, but quickly joined independent leagues, making his way to the Explorers.

▶ 2016-18: Before joining the Explorers, Gercken spent time in other independent leagues. He pitched in the Can-Am Association in 2018 for New Jersey for two years, earning a 2.08 ERA in 2018 and 2.70 ERA in 2017, combining for 81.1 innings. In 2016, Gercken had his first taste of independent baseball, pitching in the Pacific Association, earning a 6.75 ERA over 18.2 innings.

> 2015: In 2015, he played in the Twins organization late after being drafted out of the Academy of Art. He pitched 35 innings in rookie ball, allowing 26 earned runs in 35 innings with a 6.69 ERA and 1.66 WHIP.

▶ 2013-2015: Before going pro, he played three seasons for the Academy of Art Urban Knights. In his final season, he garnered a 2.90 ERA, nearly throwing 100 innings as a starter. In 2014, he had another productive season, pitching a 2.95 ERA over 82.1 innings. In his first year with the Urban Knights, he had a 4.42 ERA over 73.1 innings.

► Overview: RHP Kyle Marman joins the Explorers after spending the 2023 season in the Cleveland Guardians organization. The 27-year-old pitched in limited innings for AAA Columbus in 2023, but did well in 42 appearances for AA Akron in 2022. In college, he pitched three seasons for Florida Atlantic before being drafted in the 13th round by Cleveland in 2018.

▶ 2023: Last season, Marman faced troubles with injuries, being placed on the 60-day injured list after just four appearances for the AAA Columbus Clippers. In his limited appearances, the right-hander pitched well, posting a 4.91 ERA over 3.2 innings while striking out five and earning a win. After his stint on the IL, Marman returned on a rehab assignment to the ACL Guardians of rookie ball in late July, pitching 4.1 innings and striking out seven before being released in mid-August.

► 2022: Marman saw his first AAA action in 2022, making it to AAA Columbus after posting a 4.41 ERA in 42 appearances for the AA Akron RubberDucks. The Florida native pitched in two games for AAA Columbus that season, going 2.1 innings of one-run ball against the Toledo Mud Hens in his AAA debut Sept. 22. In his 42 appearances for AA Akron, Marman finished 13 games, earning four saves while pitching 51 innings. He struck out 66 batters in his work, posting a WHP of 1.33 as well.

▶ 2021: In 2021, Marman spent the whole season in AA Akron, pitching sparingly across the season and appearing in 20 games out of the bullpen. In his 20 games, he pitched 20 innings, striking out 20 while working a 5.85 ERA.


▶ 2019: 2019 was Marman's first season in professional baseball, starting his career with the Single-A Lake County Captains and pitching well across 24 games. He threw for 46 innings, posting a 3.33 ERA with a 1.17 WHIP and striking out 58 batters. That season included a great start where he pitched three innings of one-run ball while striking out five and earning the save in his first appearance of the season May 24 against the Lansing Lugnuts. He had several of these performances throughout the season, including one July 6 where he pitched four shutout innings, striking out four and another on July 27 where he pitched 3.2 scoreless frames, striking out seven.

▶ 2018 FAU: The 6'3 pitcher was drafted in the 13th round of the 2018 MLB Draft by the Cleveland Indians as a junior out of Florida Atlantic. That season for the Owls, he started off on fire as a starter, but suffered a season-ending injury that kept him to just five games. In his five starts, he posted a 1.45 ERA while striking out 46 batters across 31 innings, not allowing a single home run and posting a perfect 4-0 record. Those starts included two double-digit strikeout efforts, one against Delaware where he picked up 14 in 6.2 innings while not walking a batter and one against Oregon where he picked up 11 in seven shutout innings.

► 2017 FAU: In Marman's sophomore season at FAU, he pitched in 20 games, starting his final two appearances to end the season. In the season, he posted a 4.50 ERA across 28 innings, not allowing an earned run between March 5 and April 11. After the season, he pitched for the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League earning a 3.98 ERA over 20.1 innings.

>2016 FAU: Marman only pitched in three games his freshman season, totaling three innings of work before spending the summer in the Cal Ripken Collegiate League and posting a 3.07 ERA in 14.2 innings.

▶ History: Prior to college, Marman came from Dr. Phillips High School in Orlando, Fla. He is the son of Brad and Janet Marman.

► Overview: RHP Zach Willeman is set to join the Explorers this season following a year in the Miami Marlins organization. Willeman will be entering his sixth season of professional baseball, spending the past five between the Marlins, Los Angeles Dodgers and Kansas City Royals organizations. Last year was Willeman's one and only year in Miami's organization after signing a minor league contract in the offseason. In 2023, the righty pitched in 14 games with AA Pensacola, putting up a 7.13 ERA with 15 strikeouts and a 1.64 WHIP. He finished his season with a 3.60 ERA over five innings across his final four appearances.

▶ 2022: As a 26-year-old in 2022, it was Willeman's first professional season outside of the Dodgers organization, splitting time between AA and AAA for the Royals. He made the move to Kansas City's organization as the PTBNL from the Danny Duffy trade that was made in July 2021. The righty started at AA Northwest Arkansas, pitching 22.2 innings across 16 games with a 5.16 ERA, but by the end of May, he had earned a 1.59 ERA with 14 strikeouts over 11.1 innings between May 4 and May 26. After a strong showing in May, the Royals promoted him to AAA Omaha where he posted a 3.29 ERA over 13.2 innings between June 10 and July 11. He ended the season with a 0.96 ERA over 9.1 innings during his final seven games of the season.

2021: In 2021, Willeman returned to the mound in the minors after the 2020 hiatus. Throughout the season, he put up a 3.78 ERA across 47.2 innings out of the bullpen, also striking out 59 batters during that span. His season included a span of nearly two months where he held a 1.73 ERA over 26 innings between June 25 and Aug. 22 for the Drillers.
 2019: Prior to the shutdown, Willeman had an adjustment year at Single-A Great Lakes. Across the season, he had a 5.38 ERA with a 1.68 WHIP, starting his first five games of the season before being moved to a bullpen role.

▶ 2017-18: After being selected in the 19th round of the 2017 MLB Draft by the Dodgers, the then-22-year-old first appeared for the AZL Dodgers in rookie ball, allowing one earned run over 10.2 innings in five games. He was promoted to Single-A Great Lakes, where he held a 2.16 ERA with 10 strikeouts over 8.1 innings.

▶ 2015-17: Willeman was drafted out of Kent State, where he played all three of his college years. His 2017 season was his first as a true starter, beginning games in 13 of his 14 appearances. Across the season, he had a 4.91 ERA with 57 strikeouts over 66 innings. During his sophomore year of 2016, he led the Golden Flashes with 14 saves, striking out 38 in his 36.2 innings with a 2.70 ERA. He led the team in saves, posting a 2.81 ERA with 34 strikeouts over 25.2 innings, not allowing a run over his final six appearances. Willeman attended Napoleon High School in Ohio before his time in college, posting a 0.63 ERA with 121 strikeouts as a senior.

► Overview: RHP Jeremy Goins joins the Explorers neat the midseason mark for his first year of professional baseball. Goins previously pitched for the University of Tampa earlier in 2024 after spending three years there. He started his collegiate career at the College of Central Florida in 2019 before transferring to Pasco-Hernando State College for the 2021 season.


► 2024 TAM: This season with the Tampa Spartans, Goins appeared in 11 games out of the bullpen, posting a 6.23 ERA over 17.1 innings. He started the season with 6.1 consecutive innings of scoreless ball before he was tagged for his first run against Seton Hall on March 4.

► 2022 PHSC: Goins transferred from Pasco-Hernando State College after starting seven games in 2022 for the Bobcats, posting a 2.35 ERA across 38.1 innings. That season, he had several strong starts including back-to-back starts of five innings and one run allowed March 5 and March 11.

▶ 2021 PHSC: His sophomore season was with the Bobcats in 2021, starting five games and pitching 26 innings in his first season with Pasco-Hernando State. Through that year, he struck out 27 batters and earned wins against ASA Miami and South Florida State CC while picking up six strikeouts on two separate occasions.

▶ 2019 CCF: Prior to his transfer, Goins began his collegiate career with the College of Central Florida Patriots, pitching in 15 games in the 2019 season. Across his 15 games, he was a perfect 5-0 while going 33.2 innings with 28 strikeouts.

► History: The right-hander enrolled in the College of Central Florida after attending King High School and serving as the team captain in 2018. He is the son of Todd Goins and Sharmon Lenth and has an older brother, Jordyn.



▶ Overview: John Sheaks was signed on November 14, 2023, and will begin his second season with the X's in 2024. Sheaks and INF Daniel Lingua joined the Explorers for the final playoff push just before the trade delaine of the 2023 season. That pair were acquired on August 23 from the Gary SouthShore Railcats in exchange for INF Miguel Sierra and LHP Franklin Dacosta. Sheaks made a memorable first start for Sioux City on August 27 a day after his arrival in Iowa. The right-hander would toss eight scoreless innings, scattering five hits in a 3-2 win over the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks on the final regular-season home game for Sioux City. The win was also the 500th win for Manager Steve Montgomery at the helm of the Explorers. Sheaks would retire nine in a row before a walk in the seventh—his only one allowed in the game. The San Clemente, California native then would finish off his afternoon retiring the RedHawks in order in the top of the eighth inning.

► 2021-23: Sheaks only made two regular season starts for the X's and one appearance in the playoffs, but the righty had 43 starts in the three seasons he held down the top spot of the Railcats starting rotation. He went 6-7 in 2023 with Gary with a 5.22 ERA in 89.2 innings. In three seasons with the Railcats, the Long Beach State product has pitched 228.2 innings with 176 strikeouts with a 5.00 ERA. In 2022 he pitched a career high of 99 innings with a 4.64 ERA for the Railcats. He has pitched primarily as a starter, making 22 starts while making another 10 appearances out of the pen.

► 2015-2019: Sheaks attended Saddleback College in Mission Viejo, California, where he earned All-Orange Empire Conference Second Team honors while leading the Gauchos to a Conference Tournament championship as a sophomore in 2016. Upon the conclusion of his junior college career, he parlayed that success into a transfer to Long Beach State University for his final two seasons. Over his three seasons in Long Beach, Sheaks compiled a 10-5 record along with 71 strikeouts in 124.1 innings split between the starting rotation and the bullpen. He would also earn two degrees from Long Beach. Sheaks majored in Broadcast Journalism receiving his bachelor's degree and would follow that up with a Master's Degree in Public Policy and Administration.

► History: Sheaks hails from San Clemente, Californian and played two seasons on the varsity team for San Clemente High School. He recorded an 8-4 record with a 2.47 ERA in 68 innings pitched as a senior in 2014. Sheaks made seven starts and appeared six games in relief as a senior, striking out 39 batters with 17 walks.

▶ Overview: RHP Braunny Munoz was a mid-August addition to the Explorers roster after spending parts of six seasons in the Cleveland Guardians organization. Munoz was originally signed by the X's on August 16, 2023 and would pick up the relief win on August 19 at Sioux Falls. The right-hander would work four innings, scattering four hits and a pair of earned runs in a 12-5 win over the Canaries. In his short stay in the Siouxland, the native of the Dominican Republic worked in four games and made one start during the final series at Chicago. He pitched in 13.2 innings with eight strikeouts and eight walks with a 1-0 record and a 6.58 ERA.

▶ 2023 SC: Munoz finished strong with Sioux City. Following his second outing where he went four innings and gave up eight runs, he would not surrender a run over his last 5.2 innings, and he held opponents to just three hits. His spot start on September 4 at Chicago was the highlight moment of the season for Munoz with Sioux City: he held the Dogs hitless through three innings and tossed four shutout innings in a no decision with a pair of strikeouts and just one hit in a 10-3 loss.

The previous year was his first in professional baseball, pitching in the Dominican Summer League as a 17-year-old, going 63.1 innings while posting a 2.84 ERA with a 1.153 WHIP.
 History: Cleveland signed Munoz out of Cotui, Dominican Republic. For his career, Munoz has a 21-15 record in 326.2 innings with a 4.24 ERA with 285 strikeouts with a 1.350 WHIP.
